

Word	Definition	Example Sentence
deserted (adjective)	in a very poor condition as a result of disuse and neglect	Deserted beaches of soft sand.
clambered (verb)	done according to a systematic or established procedure	I clambered out of the trench.
derelict (adjective)	empty of people	A derelict Georgian mansion.
awkwardly (adverb)	in an ungainly manner; not smoothly or gracefully	She waddled up the stairs awkwardly.
methodical (adjective)	climb or move in an awkward and laborious way, typically using both hands and feet	A methodical approach to the evaluation of computer systems.
sprawling (adjective)	spreading out over a large area in an untidy or irregular way	The sprawling suburbs.
horizon (noun)	pause in indecision before saying or doing something	The sun rose above the horizon.
hesitate (verb)	the line at which the earth's surface and the sky appear to meet	She hesitated, unsure of what to say.
