Improvement Indicators



Schools can use the premium to secure improvements in the following indicators:

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
2. the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport

The Engagement of all Pupils in Regular Physical Activity

- Physical Education Staff Team
 - Sports Premium Lead and 2 Sport Coaches
 - Running curriculum PE and modelling to other staff members
 - 6-8 afterschool clubs offered each term with approx. 20 students in each
 - Development of competitive sport teams in cross country, football, gymnastics, tag rugby, NFL and cricket
- Equipment Purchases
 - Increased access to the equipment to participate in a wide variety of sports
 - Including football, basketball, netball, badminton, gymnastics, hockey, dodgeball, martial arts, dance, tag rugby, NFL flag football, cricket and rounder's.
- Spare student kit
 - Shoes have been purchased to supplement PE kit that has been sourced
 - Reduced rates of students sitting out of curriculum PE



The profile of PE and Sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement



- Increased sport related communication with parents, students and other staff
 - School sport noticeboard, letters home, social media presence
 - Smoother chain of communication
- Sport awards and student leaders identified
 - Jack Hunt sport awards
 - Class of the week sport award
 - Student playground leaders
- PESSPA reminders linked to health and wellbeing
 - School sport noticeboard
 - School events such as martial arts session and Sustrans Big Pedal competition
 - Full school assemblies by local sporting clubs and athletes
- Gladstone Primary Academy sports kit
 - Generic kit for students to wear when representing the school
 - Premier league stars donated football kit

Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport



- PE Staff to model best practice PE lessons
 - A number of teaching staff and teaching assistants have observed PE lessons conducted by PE staff
- Jack Hunt Primary Sports Partnership with links to Inspire+
 - Access to a variety of CPD such as FRIENDS resilience training, swimming, Dance, Gymnastics, PE Advisory Meetings, NFL, etc.
 - Support network with local schools
 - Playground leader sessions conducted with students, PE staff and midday supervisors
- Midday Supervisor sessions
 - Midday supervisors have been working with PE staff to run games and activities on the playground
 - Attended two sessions with Inspire+ in regards to playground games and activities

Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils



- School PE team to run lunchtime and afterschool clubs/activities
 - Lunchtime clubs run Monday – Wednesday for 3 half terms in sports such as cricket, dodgeball and football each week with 15-35 members in each
 - Class competitions run at lunchtimes in football and dodgeball for 3 half terms
 - Team trainings such as cross country, football, etc. able to be run at lunchtimes to allow all students in the team to participate regularly.

 - Students have competed in competitions with local primary schools in sports such as King Ball, Multiskills, Football, End Ball, NFL and Rowing
 - Invite to the Year 3/4 Mini Olympics

 - KS2 Gymnastics competitions
 - Year 5/6 Tag Rugby competition
 - KS2 Kwik Cricket
- Source additional competitions
 - TDET Football Tournament held in Spring Term
